DECLARATION OF DEBBIE COFFEY

I, Debbie Coffey, declare as follows:

- 1. I am the volunteer Vice President and Director of Wild Horse Affairs of Wild Horse Freedom Federation (WHFF). I have personal knowledge of the facts stated herein and, if requested, I could and would testify to the same.
- 2. Attached as Exhibit A is the letter I received in response to WHFF's Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") Request No. 2011-00558. As the letter reflects, I filed FOIA requests for, and received all Environmental Assessments for Long Term Holding ("LTH") facilities. These EAs allowed me to map out where the LTH facilities were.
- 3. I also obtained inventories, through FOIA requests, of the number of horses BLM reported at each LTH facility.
- 4. WHFF personnel (myself, R.T. Fitch, and Terry Fitch) then embarked on an independent analysis of the horses in LTH facilities, in order to compare the numbers of horses and burros claimed to be in LTH facilities with the numbers actually there.
- 5. We used software to map out the route for our investigation, using public roads around and through LTH facilities that we had identified based on our studies of the maps of the LTH facilities.
- 6. Attached as Exhibit B is the letter I received in response to WHFF's ("FOIA") Request No. 2015-00745. As the letter reflects, I filed FOIA requests for, and received the BLM's claimed inventory at each of the facilities we visited, and these documents include inventories on the very days that we visited them.
- 7. We carefully counted the horses at each LTH facility we visited. At every single facility, we observed far fewer horses than the BLM facility reports claimed were at every one of these locations. Specifically:

- (a) On October 11, 2013, we visited the Tishomingo LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 595 horses on site that day we could count only 100.
- (b) On October 12, 2013, we visited the Catoosa LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 2010 horses on site that day we could count only 600.
- (c) On October 121, 2013, we visited the Nowata LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 846 horses on site that day we could count only 400.
- (d) On March 21, 2014, we visited the Foster LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 746 horses on site that day we could count only 300.
- (e) On March 21, 2014, we visited the Pawhuska LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 3294 horses on site that day we could count only 1000.
- (f) On March 21, 2014, we visited the Strohm LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 877 horses on site that day we could count only 400.
- (g) On March 22, 2014, we visited the Foster LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 746 horses on site that day we could count only 300.
- (h) On March 22, 2014, we visited the Hickory LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 1498 horses on site that day we could count only 50.
- (i) On March 22, 2014, we visited the Tishomingo LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 599 horses on site that day we could count only 150.

- 8. At a majority of the LTH facilities, we could see for miles, and were able to view most of the land included in the facility's boundaries.
- 9. Our counts always were curved up to account for any grouping of horses or horses we might have not seen. We used high power telephoto lenses and binoculars to be sure our counts were accurate.
- 10. In addition to these manual counts, we took video and still photos at each LTH facility that confirm our findings.
- 11. We could not see everywhere in most facilities, but saw most of the area, so that the disparities between the BLM inventories on that day and our counts cannot be explained.

This is a final response of 1,022 responsive pages to your FOIA request dated April 29, 2016, which was received by the Office of Inspector General (OIG) on the same date. Please note that this office on October 5, 2016, provided you with a partial response of 889 pages of responsive materials. You requested the following information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552: a copy of the full, report (including any attachments and exhibits to the report) of the DOI OIG Investigative Report of Bureau of Land Management Wild Horse Buyer.

For purposes of your request you have been categorized as an "other-use" requester. As such, charges may be made for search and duplication costs. You are entitled up to 2 hours of search time and 100 pages of photocopies (or an equivalent volume) for free. See 43 C.F.R. § 2.39. If, after taking into consideration your fee category entitlements, our processing costs are less than \$50.00, we will not bill you because the cost of collection would be greater than the fee collected. See 43 C.F.R. § 2.49(a)(1). In this case, no fee has been assessed.

We obtained the documents you seek and conducted a review of the material you requested. After reviewing this information we have determined that we may release information. Personal identifiers referring to yourself have been released only to you. If requested by a member of the public, these identifiers would be subject to consideration, and possible non-disclosure, under the various FOIA exemptions. After reviewing this information we have determined that we may release 1,022 pages of responsive documents with FOIA redactions pursuant to exemption 5 U.S.C. § (b)(7)(C).

FOIA requires that agencies generally disclose records. Agencies may only withhold requested records only if one or more of nine exemptions apply. These sections exempt from disclosure are items that pertain to records of information compiled for law enforcement purpose, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

Exemption 7 allows agencies to refuse to disclose records compiled for law enforcement purposes under any one of six circumstances (identified as exemptions 7 (A) through 7 (F)). Law enforcement within the meaning of Exemption 7 includes enforcement pursuant to both civil and criminal statutes.

Specifically, Exemption 7(C) permits an agency to withhold information contained in files compiled for law enforcement purposes if production "could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." U.S.C. § 552 (b)(7)(C). Thus, the purposed of Exemption 7 (C) is to protect the privacy interest exists, we must evaluate not only the nature of the personal information found in the records, but also whether release of that information to the general public could affect that individual adversely. We find that release of personal information withheld here reasonably could be expected to have a negative impact on an individual's privacy. Even if a privacy interest exists, we must nevertheless disclose the requested information if the public interest outweighs the privacy interest in the information requested. You have not established that release of the privacy information of witnesses, interviewee, middle and low ranking federal employees and investigators, and other individuals name in the investigatory file, would shed light on government operations, and we have not found such a public interest in this case. For this reason, after reviewing the information in question, we have determined that disclosure would be an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy and we must withhold this information under FOIA Exemption 7 (C).

We reasonably foresee that disclosure would harm an interest protected by one or more of the nine exemptions to the FOIA's general rule of disclosure.

If you disagree with this response, you may appeal this response to the Department's FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer. If you choose to appeal, the FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer must receive your FOIA appeal **no later than 90 workdays** from the date of this letter if Appeals arriving or delivered after 5 p.m. Eastern Time, Monday through Friday, will be deemed received on the next workday.

- 1) All Monthly Status Reports from March 2007 November 2011 from Central Utah Correctional Facility in Gunnison Utah in connection with BLM wild horses (as referenced in the Financial Assistance Agreement).
- 2) The Financial Assistance Agreement (JSA071001) between BLM and Utah Correctional Facilities/Central Utah Correctiona Facility, sent to me by your office in my previous FOIA Request, was only a 1 year agreement and dated 3/16/07. Since this program has been ongoing, I am requesting all subsequent financial assistance agreements and/or documents (whatever they are titled) extending/renewing this agreement from March 2008 to present (November 2011) in connection with Central Utah Correctional Facility (Utah Correctional Industries seems to be the authorized representative).

I request that the information I seek be provided in electronic format, and I would like to receive it on a personal computer disk (or a CD-ROM).

I am requesting a fee wavier pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, which provides:

"Documents shall be furnished without charge or at a reduced charge where the agency determines that waiver or reduction of fee is in the public interest because furnishing the information can be considered as primarily benefiting the public." [Title 5, Section 552(a)(4)(A)]

I believe that my request satisfies the criterion for fee waiver or reduction because:

- 1. The management of wild horses and burros on our public lands is well-established as a matter of legitimate public interest and concern.
- 2. The disclosure of the requested record would not be to my primary benefit, but would be to the primary benefit of the general public. I also believe the information I am requesting will contribute to public understanding regarding this issue that did not previously exist.

concerned American citizen. I'm NOT seeking these records for commercial use, and therefore I request that all review fees be waived entirely.

- 4. The disclosure of the information requested will help better inform the American public about the operations of our government, specifically the federal wild horse and burro program.
- 5. My articles are focused on public education, and all materials and information requested will be disseminated to the public for this purpose.

DECLARATION OF R.T. FITCH

I, R.T. Fitch, declare as follows:

- 1. I am the President of Wild Horse Freedom Federation (WHFF). I have personal knowledge of the facts stated herein and, if requested, I could and would testify to the same.
- 2. WHFF's Director of Wild Horse Affairs, Debbie Coffey, obtained Environmental Assessments for wild horse Long Term Holding ("LTH") facilities. She used those EAs to map out where the LTH facilities were.
- 3. Ms. Coffey also obtained inventories, through FOIA requests, of the number of horses BLM reported at each LTH facility.
- 4. WHFF personnel (myself, Ms. Coffey, and Terry Fitch) then embarked on an independent analysis of the horses in LTH facilities, in order to compare the numbers of horses and burros claimed to be in LTH facilities with the numbers actually there.
- 5. We used software to map out the route for our investigation, using public roads around and through LTH facilities that we had identified based on our studies of the maps of the LTH facilities.
- 6. Through publicly available documents and Freedom of Information Act requests, WHFF was able to obtain contemporaneous inventories of horses that the BLM reported were at each LTH facility we visited.
- 7. We carefully counted the horses at each LTH facility we visited. At every single facility, we observed far fewer horses than the BLM facility reports claimed were at every one of these locations. Specifically:
- (a) On October 11, 2013, we visited the Tishomingo LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 595 horses on site that day we could count only 100.

- (b) On October 12, 2013, we visited the Catoosa LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 2010 horses on site that day we could count only 600.
- (c) On October 121, 2013, we visited the Nowata LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 846 horses on site that day we could count only 400.
- (d) On March 21, 2014, we visited the Foster LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 746 horses on site that day we could count only 300.
- (e) On March 21, 2014, we visited the Pawhuska LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 3294 horses on site that day we could count only 1000.
- (f) On March 21, 2014, we visited the Strohm LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 877 horses on site that day we could count only 400.
- (g) On March 22, 2014, we visited the Foster LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 746 horses on site that day we could count only 300.
- (h) On March 22, 2014, we visited the Hickory LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 1498 horses on site that day we could count only 50.
- (i) On March 22, 2014, we visited the Tishomingo LTH facility. The BLM inventory for that date indicated there were 599 horses on site that day we could count only 150.
 - 8. At a majority of the LTH facilities, we could see for miles, and were able to view most of the land included in the facility's boundaries.

- 9. Our counts always were curved up to account for any grouping of horses or horses we might have not seen. We used high power telephoto lenses and binoculars to be sure our counts were accurate.
- 10. In addition to these manual counts, we took video and still photos at each LTH facility that confirm our findings.
- 11. We could not see everywhere in most facilities, but saw most of the area, so that the disparities between the BLM inventories on that day and our counts cannot be explained.

authority was to allow the public to take the horses as their private property and own them. Sale horses, which have been passed for adoption at least three times or are a certain age, are less trainable. said that if someone intends to inflict harm on the horses, then the BLM is concerned.
did not believe that BLM had a quota for how many horses would be sold each year. Thus there was no pressure on staff, by senior leadership, to dispose of a certain number of horses. Although there were no incentives to sell a certain number of horses, acknowledged that BLM management had established performance targets for each state (not employees) on adoptions, compliances, and gathers.
After the Davis matter was brought to the BLM director's attention, or BLM asked WHB managers to review and "tighten up" their policies to make it difficult or impossible to harm horses. subsequently assigned this responsibility to who is currently working with a team to develop such policy. In the interim, WHB has implemented a short term policy that limits the number of horses purchased to four within a six month period. is responsible for reviewing and approving any request exceeding this limit. BLM has also ceased paying for the transportation of sale horses to purchasers. In sum, wants a program that provides no economic incentive for anyone to harm purchased horses.
opined that for the welfare of wild horses sold under BLM's WHB, BLM staff needed to exercise more due diligence. While she realized that BLM needed to be more creative and exploratory in getting horses into good homes, she admitted that it was difficult obtaining creative ideas. believed that training more wild horses was one possible solution. On the other hand, questioned the cost effectiveness of shipping wild horses to various events for adoption and believed that there were better cost saving approaches. She noted that the money from the adoption of horses is used by WHB to market their program.
recognized that WHB's database, WHBPS, was another issue that needed addressed within the adoption and sales programs. As background, the WHBPS database is used to track wild horses that have been freeze marked, adopted, and/or sold. While was able to access WHBPS to conduct limited queries, WHB employee controlled all rights to the system. The system, in opinion, was unreliable and problematic since different results could be obtained for the same query. She argued that WHB needed a reliable system, capable of providing accurate numbers that WHB could use and stand behind.

- (2) Sufficient land and forage shall be made available for the number of horses maintained. However, as the herd is reduced by mortality or removal, pastures may be converted to domestic livestock use by the contractor, provided the use does not interfere with the wild horses. Stocking domestic horses adjacent to or with the wild horses is unacceptable.
- (3) The available standing vegetation in pastures must be of sufficient nutritive quality and quantity to maintain the horses in good condition yearlong, with supplemental feeding as described in paragraph f, below. Good condition is described as follows: ribs cannot be visually distinguished, but can be easily felt; backbone is not visible; hip bones do not show; withers are distinguishable but do not protrude; shoulders and neck blend smoothly into the body.
- (4) The stocking rate for the site shall be adjusted as necessary to assure horses are maintained in good condition, as described above.
- (5) Shelter from the natural elements shall be provided in each pasture by the topography (e.g., canyons, hills, etc.), other natural features such as trees, or manmade structures.

# C.2 INFORMATION SPECIFIC TO EACH HERD MANAGEMENT AREA OR TERRITORY

- a. Specific historical information concerning each Herd Management Area (HMA) or Territory can be obtained from the respective administrative office of jurisdiction. It should be noted that certain HMAs or Territories may have a past history of removals, population inventories, and research activities involving collaring of wild horses and burros, limited access, and other disturbances to the wild horses and burros or their habitat. In addition, under conditions of emergency, some wild horses and burros may require special treatment to compensate for their weakened condition such as provision of grass hay, additional water and/or pens
- Trapping activities would be on the HMAs and/or territories or outside HMA's territories specified in the task order.
   However trapping could be required on adjacent federal, state, tribal, military, or private lands.
- c. If trapping operations include work on military and or other restricted areas, the contractor will be required to obtain all necessary clearances to conduct operations for equipment and personnel.

#### C.3 TASK ORDERS

During the contract period a work order will be issued to the Contractor for trapping as needed by the Government. The specific work to be performed shall be stated in the individual task order. Each task order will contain the following information:

- Description of the general work performance area and maps as necessary.
- Identification of the location for the bait trapping and removal of wild horses and burros.

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- c. Details as to location of bands to be trapped or other information that is pertinent to the bait trap gather operation.
- d. Number of wild horses and burros to be trapped and removed.
- e. Numbers of wild horses and burros within general work performance area(s) noting data such as animal concentration, terrain, physical barriers and any weather conditions that may restrict trapping activities.
- f. Scheduled pre-performance conference date.
- g. Location of Wilderness, Wilderness Study Areas, cultural properties or other areas with restricted access.
- h. Required performance time
- i. The transportation destination point and approximate number of miles from the trap site(s).
- Whether the job will require certified weed free hay.
- k. The COR/PI shall require the contractor to provide the ingredients and the formula for any type of bait that will be used under this contract. Contractor shall ensure any know ingredients that can be harmful to animals will not be part of the bait materials.

#### C.4 TRAPPING AND ANIMAL CARE

The primary concern of the contractor is the safety of all personnel involved and humane handling of all wild horses and burros captured:

- a. Some trap sites will require a staging area as determined by the COR/PI.
- b. All trap and staging areas locations must be approved by the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) and/or the Project Inspector (PI) prior to construction. The Contractor may also be required to change or move trap locations as determined by the COR/PI. All traps and staging facilities not located on public land must have prior written approval of the landowner.
- c. The capture attempts may be accomplished by utilizing bait (feed, mineral supplement or water) or sexual attractants (mares in heat) to lure wild horses and burros into a temporary trap. All capture attempts shall incorporate the following:
  - All feed bait ingredients, and the formula in that bait will be given to the COR/PI one full week prior to using in the trap.
  - When using water as the bait, other water sources shall not be cut off in the bait area. If the government determines that cutting off other water sources is the best action to take under this contract, elimination of other water sources shall not last longer than 48 continuous hours.
- d. All traps, wings, and staging facilities shall be constructed, maintained and operated to handle the wild horses and burros in a safe and humane manner and be in accordance with the following:
  - 1. Darting of wild horses and wild burros will not be allowed.
  - 2. Traps and staging facilities shall be constructed of portable panels or equal material, the top of which shall not be less than 72 inches high for horses and 60 inches for burros, and the bottom rail of which shall not be more than 12 inches from ground level. All traps and staging facilities shall be flowing design without corners. All material used will be flush at the top and bottom, no protrusions, sharp areas.
  - 3. No barbed wire material shall be used in the construction of any traps.
  - All loading alleys shall be a minimum of 6 feet high for horses and 5 feet high for burros and shall be fully covered on the sides with, tarps, plywood, etc.

- 5. All crowding pens including the gates leading to the alleyways shall be covered with a material which serves as a visual barrier, (plywood, burlap, plastic snow fence, tarps etc.) and shall be covered a minimum of 1 foot to 5 feet above ground level for burros and 2 feet to 6 feet for horses. Perimeter panels on the staging corrals shall be covered to a minimum height of 5 feet for burros and 6 feet for horses.
- Self-latching gates will be used on all pens and alleyways for the movement and handling of wild horses and burros.
- 7. No modification of existing fences will be made without authorization from the COR/PI. The Contractor shall be responsible for restoration of any fence modification which he has made.
- 8. Wild horses and burros trapped at trap sites may need to be sorted into small sorting pens determined by age or sex in order to safely transport them to a BLM preparation facility or a staging area.
- Sick and injured wild horses and burros, and strays will be separated as needed. Segregation will be at the discretion of the COR.
- 10. Wild horses and burros will not be held in the trap for more than 24 hours.
- 11. A staging area will be required away from the trap site for any wild horses and burros that are being held for more than 24 hours.
- 12. The contractor shall assure that wet mares and their foal shall not be separated.
- 13. Finger gates may be constructed of materials such as, juniper poles, pipe, etc., only with the prior approval and direction of the COR. Finger gates shall not be constructed of materials such as "T" posts, sharpened willows, etc. that may be injurious to wild horses and burros.
- 14. All trigger and/or trip gate devices must be approved by the COR prior to capture of wild horses and burros.
- 15. Traps shall be checked a minimum of once every 24 hours when traps are "set" to capture wild horses and burros.
- Contractor will report any injuries that resulted from trapping operations as well as pre-existing injuries to the COR and BLM preparation facility.
- 17. The COR/PI may assist with the handling of wild horses and burros.
- e. At the discretion of the COR/PI the Contractor may be required to delay shipment of horses until the COR/PI inspects the wild horses and burros at the trap site prior to transporting them to the BLM preparation facility.

#### C.5 STAGING AREA AND ANIMAL CARE

The staging area will only be used when approved by the COR

- a. Sorting pens shall be of sufficient size to minimize (minimal 100 square feet per adult horse and or burro with only having a maximum of 25 wild horses or burros being held at any other time), to the extent possible, injury due to fighting and trampling as well as to allow wild horses and burros to move easily and have adequate access to water and feed.
- b. All pens will be capable of expansion on request of the COR. Alternate pens, within the staging facility shall be furnished by the Contractor to separate mares or Jennies with small foals, sick and injured wild horses and burros, and estrays from the other wild horses and burros.
- c. The Contractor shall provide wild horses and burros held in the staging area with a supply of fresh clean water at a minimum rate of 10 gallons per animal per day.

- d. Wild horses and burros approved to be held by the COR will be provided good quality hay at the rate of not less than two pounds of hay per 100 pounds of estimated body weight per day. If the task order notes that weed free hay is to be used for this bait trap gather the contractor will provide certified weed free hay in the amounts stated above. The contractor will have to have documentation that the hay is certified weed free.
- e. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to provide security to prevent loss, injury or death of captured wild horses and burros until delivery to final destination. Animals lost from traps shall not be included in payment schedule.
- f. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to provide for the safety of the wild horses and burros and personnel working at the trap locations and staging area.
- g. The Contractor shall restrain sick or injured wild horses and burros if treatment is necessary in consultation with the COR and/or veterinarian. The contractor in consultation with the COR will determine if injured wild horses and burros must be destroyed and provide for destruction of such wild horses and burros in accordance with the BLM Euthanasia policy. (Section J) The Contractor will have the ability to humanely euthanize wild horses and burros in the field and to dispose of the carcasses in accordance with state and local laws.
- h. Separate water troughs shall be provided for each pen where wild horses and burros are being held. Water troughs shall be constructed of such material (e.g., rubber, plastic, fiberglass, galvanized metal with rolled edges, and rubber over metal) so as to avoid injury to the wild horses and burros.
- The use of solid covered panels or visual barriers in the alley ways keeps the animals from kicking thru the panels.
- j. All gates and panels are covered with snow fence for the safety of wild horses and burros.
- k. Wild horses and burros will be fed twice a day per a schedule determined by the COR/PI and will have water in every pen.

## C.6 TRANSPORTATION AND ANIMAL CARE

- a. Wild horses and burros shall be transported to BLM preparation facilities within 24 hours after capture unless prior approval is granted by the COR/PI for unusual circumstances.
- b. The Contractor shall schedule shipments of wild horses and burros to arrive at BLM preparation facilities between 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. unless prior approval has been obtained by the COR. No shipments shall be scheduled to arrive at BLM preparation facilities on Sunday and Federal holidays; unless prior approval has been obtained by the COR.
- c. Wild horses and burros shall not be allowed to remain standing on gooseneck or semi-trailers while not in transport for a combined period of greater than three (3) hours.
- d. Total drive time from the trap site or staging area to the BLM preparation facilities will not exceed 8 hours.
- All motorized equipment employed in the transportation of captured wild horses and burros shall be in compliance
  with appropriate State and Federal laws and regulations applicable to the humane transportation of wild horses
  and burros.
- f. All equipment used to transport wild horses and burros will be inspected and accepted by the COR/PI prior to use to avoid any injury to wild horses and burros and shall be in good mechanical condition, of adequate rated capacity, and operated so as to ensure that captured wild horses and burros are transported without undue risk.
- g. No open stock trailers shall be allowed for transporting wild horses and burros from trap site(s) or staging area to the BLM preparation facilities.
- Sides or stock racks of all trailers used for transporting wild horses and burros shall be a minimum height of 6 feet
   inches from the floor. A minimum of one partition is required in each stock trailer.

- i. The rear door(s) of the stock trailers must be capable of opening the full width of the trailer. All partitions and panels the inside of all trailers must be free of sharp edges or holes that could cause injury to the wild horses and burros. The material facing the inside of all trailers must be strong enough so that the wild horses and burros cannot push their hooves through the side-
- j. All surfaces of the stock trailers shall be cleaned and a disinfectant used to eliminate the possibility of disease transmittal from domesticated horses to wild horses and burros (WH&B's) prior to the WH&B's under this contract being transported.
- k. Floors of stock trailers and loading chutes shall be covered and maintained with anti-slip materials (mats, wood shavings, sand etc.) to prevent wild horses and burros from slipping.
- Wild horses and burros to be loaded and transported in any size trailer shall be as directed by the COR and may include limitations on numbers according to age, sex, size, temperament and animal condition. The following minimum square feet per animal shall be allowed in all trailers
  - 1. 12.6 square feet per adult horse (1.8 linear foot in a 7 foot wide trailer)
  - 2. 8.0 square feet per adult burro (1.15 linear foot in a 7 foot wide trailer)
  - 3. 6.0 square feet per horse foal (0.85 linear foot in a 7 foot wide trailer)
  - 4. 4.0 square feet per burro foal (0.57 linear feet in a 7 foot wide trailer)
- m. The COR shall consider the condition and size of the wild horses and burros, weather conditions, distance to be transported, or other factors when planning for the movement of captured wild horses and burros. The COR shall provide for any brand and/or inspection services required for the captured wild horses and burros. If wild horses and burros are to be transported over state lines the COR will be responsible work with the receiving state veterinarian to get permission to transport the wild horses and burros without a health certificate or coggins test. If the receiving state does not allow wild horses or burros in their state without a current health certificate or coggins test the COR/PI will obtain them through a local veterinarian prior to shipment.
- An electric prod, paddle or wild rag may be humanely used to work wild horses and burros during sorting and loading operations.
- o. Flagging will be used strategically so not to desensitize the animal(s).
- p. When transporting wild horses and burros, drivers shall check for downed animals.
- q. The contractor will separate the animals in trailer compartments so animals do not pile up in the rear of the trailer during transport from trap site to staging area/BLM preparation facility. Separation of animals helps prevent animals from falling down and being trampled.
- r. All sorting, loading or unloading wild horses and burros will be performed during daylight hours unless supplemental light is provided in the area to facilitate visibility.
- s. Provide a visual barrier on panels in the area where the loading is accomplished at the trap site and at the staging area to eliminate holes, gaps, or openings where horses can be injured.
- t. The contractor may dig holes at the end of the loading alley so that trailer floor is at ground level to ease the loading horses or burros at the trap site
- u. Hot shots should not be used routinely or excessively on wild horses or burros. Use of hot shots should be limited to instances of trying to protect or preserve human or animal safety (such as with animals that are down and reluctant to get up on trailers and in chutes) or as a near final resort for animals that refuse to move or load. Hot shots should only be used as follows:
- v. Hotshots should never be applied to 3 areas: the head (defined as everything above the throatlatch), anus and genitals (this includes the vulva, penis, and scrotum as well as the anogenital area which includes the anal recess, underside of the tail and the perineum which is the area between the anus and the vulva)

- w. Only unmodified, commercially available hotshots that use DC battery power may be used, batteries should be maintained fresh at all times to avoid the overuse of apparently ineffective devices
- x. A hot shot should only be used after 3 other stimuli have failed to successfully encourage forward movement (other options include use of body position and movement, use of voice or whistle, use of a wild rag to flag an animal, use of a shaker paddle as a visual and auditory stimulus, tapping animal with flag or shaker paddle, use of plastic tarp or bag, and returning animal to the point of origin and starting over.
- y. A hot shot should be used to shock an animal not more than 3 times on any single occasion
- z. A hot should only be used when a path of escape or movement away from the stimulus is available (animals should not be encouraged to "push-up" with or without a hotshot this too often leads to trampling)

#### C.7 SAFETY AND COMMUNICATION

The BLM/FS reserves the right to remove from service_immediately any contractor personnel or contractor furnished equipment which, in the opinion of the contracting officer or COR violate contract rules, are unsafe or otherwise unsatisfactory. In this event, the Contractor will be notified in writing to furnish replacement personnel or equipment within 48 hours of notification. All such replacements must be approved in advance of operation by the Contracting Officer or his/her representative

- a. The Contractor shall have the means to communicate with the COR/PI and all contractor personnel engaged in the capture of wild horses and burros utilizing a cell/satellite phone at all times during the trapping operations.
- b. Contractor will contact the COR/PI prior to loading horses to be delivered to BLM preparation facility.
- c. Contractor will contact BLM facility manager to schedule delivery and relay information of wild horses and burros trapped (number of wild horses and burros trapped, sex, approximate age, number of pairs, etc.)
- d. Contractor will photo document all horses trapped in a digital image format and digital photos will be delivered to the COR.
- e. Contractor will be required to provide State or National Rifle Association certification or equivalent (conceal carry, hunter safety, etc.) for firearm safety.
- f. All accidents involving wild horses and burros or people that occur during the performance of any task order shall be immediately reported to the COR/PI.
- g. All domestic stock used for or around the bait trap or staging area will have current Coggins documentation and a health certificate. Trailers will be cleaned and have a disinfectant applied after any domestic horses have been hauled in it and before any WH&B's are loaded. This will help prevent transmission of disease into our populations at a BLM Preparation Facility

## C.8 PUBLIC AND MEDIA

Due to heightened public interest in wild horse and burro gathers, the BLM/Contractor may expect an increasing number of requests from the public and media to view the operation.

- a. Due to this type of operation (luring wild horses and burros to bait) spectators and viewers will be prohibited as it will have impacts on the ability to capture wild horses and burros. Only essential personnel (COR/PI, veterinarian, contractor, contractor employees, etc.) will be allowed at the trap site during operations.
- Public viewing of the wild horses and burros trapped may be provided at the staging area and/or the BLM
  preparation facility by appointment.
- c. The Contractor agrees that there shall be no release of information to the news media regarding the removal or remedial activities conducted under this contract.
- d. All information will be released to the news media by the assigned government public affairs officer.

e. If the public or media interfere in any way with the trapping operation, such that the health and wellbeing of the crew, horses and burros is threatened, the trapping operation will be suspended until the situation is resolved.

#### C.9 CONTRACTOR FURNISHED PROPERTY

- a. As specified herein, it is the contractor's responsibility to provide all necessary support equipment and vehicles, bait, hay water, water, troughs, for the wild horses and burros and any other needed items, personnel, vehicles (which shall include good condition trucks and stock trailers to haul horses and burros from the trap site to the staging area/BLM preparation facility).
- b. If inclement weather or poor road conditions occur during trapping operations the contractor will need the necessary equipment to safely transport wild horses and burros to a BLM preparation facility.
- The Contractor must have adequate equipment and materials needed for safely bait trapping wild horses and burros.
- d. The Contractor must have adequate equipment and materials needed to safely hold horses and burros in a staging area.
- e. The Contractor shall have a cell phone and or satellite phone that is operational in the zone they are working.
- The Contractor shall have a digital image camera or video camera.
- g. The Contractor will be required to have a firearm adequate for euthanizing wild horses and burros.

## C.10 COR/PI RESPONSIBILITIES

- a. In emergency situations, the COR/PI will implement procedures to protect animals as rehab is initiated, ie. Rationed feeding and watering at trap and or staging area.
- b. The COR/PI will authorize the contractor to euthanize any wild horse or burros as an act of mercy.
- The COR/PI will ensure wild horses or burros with pre-existing conditions are euthanized in the field according to BLM policy.
- d. Prior to setting up a trap or staging area on public land, the BLM and/or Forest Service will conduct all necessary clearances (archaeological, T&E, etc.). All proposed sites must be inspected by a government archaeologist or equivalent. Once archaeological clearance has been obtained, the trap or staging area may be set up. Said clearances shall be arranged for by the COR/PI.
- e. The COR/PI will provide the contractor with all pertinent information on the areas and wild horses and burros to be trapped.
- f. The COR/PI will be responsible to establish the frequency of communicating with the contractor.
- g. The COR/PI shall inspect trap operation prior to Contractor initiating trapping.
- h. The Contractor shall make all efforts to allow the COR/PI to observe a minimum of at least 25% of the trapping activity.
- i. The COR/PI is responsible to arrange for a brand inspector and/or veterinarian to inspect all wild horses and burros prior to transporting to a BLM preparation facility when legally required.
- j. The COR/PI will be responsible for the establishing a holding area for administering PZP, gelding of stallions, holding animals in poor condition until they are ready of shipment, holding for EIA testing, etc.

k. The COR/PI will ensure the trailers are cleaned and disinfected before WH&B's are transported. This will help

prevent transmission of disease into our populations at a BLM Preparation Facility.

- Inspection of all items under this contract shall be accomplished by the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR), or the representative designated in writing by the Contracting Officer.
- b. Acceptance of all work and effort under this contract (including "Reporting Requirements", if any) shall be accomplished by the Contracting Officer or the designated COR.

# F.3 PROCEDURES USED TO DETERMINE PERFORMANCE TIME FRAMES

- a. Contractor will initiate work within 30 days of task order issuance. Performance times shall be designated in each task order for the established estimated quantities. Contractor and COR may determine to cease trapping activities during the time set forth in the task order if successful trapping has significantly declined.
- b. Each task order will provide a range of horses or burros to be trapped from the work area. For example the contractor may be required to prepare for trapping of as many as 100 wild horses and burros and as few as 10 wild horses and burros per delivery. Contractor shall only be paid per head for actual amount of horses/burros trapped. Contractor shall cease operations when the estimated quantity of trapped horse/burros is achieved.

# SECTION G - CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION DATA

# G.1 CONTRACTING OFFICER'S REPRESENTATIVES (COR) AND/OR PROJECT INSPECTOR (PI)

#### a. On-Site COR

COR's will be appointed by the Contracting Officer upon issuance of this contract. When trapping is being conducted, such On-Site COR's will be responsible for giving the Contractor any special instructions or guidance necessary to complete performance as required by the contract. These individuals do not have the authority to modify or in any way amend the terms of this contract.

## b. Off-Site COR

An Off-Site COR, located in the BLM Nevada State Office (Reno), shall be appointed by the Contracting Officer at the time the contract(s) are awarded. The Off-Site COR will be responsible for coordinating bait traping between the BLM Field Offices, the Nevada State Office, and the National Operation Center (NOC). The Off-Site COR shall also be responsible for scheduling the bait trapping for each season. If there are any problems and/or questions between the on-site COR and the Contractor, one or both will contact the off-site COR in Reno.

# G.2 ELECTRONIC INVOICING AND PAYMENT REQUIREMENTS – INTERNET PAYMENT PLATFORM (IPP) (AUG 2011)

- Payment requests must be submitted electronically through the U. S. Department of the Treasury's Internet Payment Platform System (IPP).
- b. "Payment request" means any request for contract financing payment or invoice payment by the Contractor. c. Under this contract, the following documents are required to be submitted as an attachment to the IPP invoice:

#### G.4 APPROPRIATION DATA

No funds are obligated by this contract. Funds for individual task orders issued under the terms and conditions of this contract will cite the appropriate accounting and appropriation data.

#### G.5 CORRESPONDENCE PROCEDURES

To promote timely and effective administration, correspondence submitted under this contract shall include the contract number and shall be subject to the following procedures:

- a. Technical Correspondence. Technical correspondence (as used herein, excludes technical correspondence where patent or technical data issues are involved and correspondence which proposes or otherwise involves waivers, deviations, or modifications to the requirements, terms, or conditions, of this contract) shall be addressed to the off- site COR, with an information copy of the correspondence to the Contracting Officer.
- b. Other Correspondence. All correspondence, other than technical correspondence shall be addressed to the Contracting Officer, with information copies of the correspondence to the COR.

#### SECTION H – SPECIAL CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

#### H.1 CRITERIA FOR ISSUING TASK ORDERS

- a. Each awarded contract will have a guaranteed minimum as noted in Section B per Zone.
- b. Minimum and Maximum's are per the zone and not reflective of each potential Contract awarded under this solicitation. Minimums and Maximums are yearly to include each Option Period, if so exercised.
- c. Task orders will be issued at the discretion of the CO and/or COR based on the availability of each contractor, the location of the trapping and any other factors determined appropriate.
- d. Minimums and Maximums will distributed equally among awarded contracts under each zone award(s), (Example- A Zone 400 minimum head count would equal 400 minimum on contract if only one contract is awarded under the zone and 200 minimum per contract if two contracts are awarded for that zone.)
- e. In all cases the government reserves the right to perform trapping "in-house" without using contractors.

#### H.2 BASIS FOR PAYMENT

- a. The Contractor shall be paid the corresponding contract per head price for the applicable Zone and for the actual number of animals trapped at the trapping site. This shall also include the following:
- b. Killed or destroyed (at the direction of the COR and/or veterinarian) without any fault or negligence on the part of the Contractor or its employees, or;
- c. Released back to the public lands at the direction of the COR/PI. The Contractor shall not be entitled to payment for trapping any animals which are lost, killed or destroyed during capture due to the fault or negligence on the part of the Contractor or its employees.
- d. Payment shall be made at the U/P shown on the Price Schedule (Section B) for the feeding and care of those animals at the temporary holding facility. The Contractor shall not be entitled to payment for any animals held for a portion of a day (feed day is defined as an overnight stay, from at least 5:00 p.m. until the following morning). The Contractor shall not be entitled to payment for feeding and caring of any animals which are killed or destroyed due to the fault or negligence on the part of the Contractor or its employees while the animals are at the trap site or temporary holding facility.
- e. Payment shall be made at the U/P shown on the Price Schedule (Section B) for those animals which have been transported, and;
- f. Delivered live to final destination or
- g. Killed or destroyed (at the direction of the COR/PI) without any fault or negligence of the Contractor or its employees. The Contractor shall not be entitled to payment for transportation of any animals which are killed or destroyed during transportation due to the fault or negligence on the part of the Contractor or its employees.

#### H.3 WORK HOURS

Bait trapping which may be conducted 24 hours per day. No work shall be done on Federal holidays unless mutually agreeable between the COR and the contractor and authorized by the CO.

#### H.4 PREWORK CONFERENCE

After a task order has been issued, a pre-work conference will be held. The date and time of the meeting shall be determined by both parties in consultation. Discussions pertaining to contract and task order requirements, and the specific responsibilities of each party will be conducted at this time. The BLM will inform the contractor about

any anticipated public and/or media attendance at the trapping and who will be escorting them. The contractor will give the COR/PI a list of all personnel that is working the trapping operation.

#### H.5 NOTICE TO PROCEED

A Notice to Proceed shall be issued at each pre-work conference held. The Contractor shall have five (5) working days, from issuance of said Notice to Proceed, to commence performance or at a mutually agreed upon date.

#### H.6 POST AWARD/PRE-WORK CONFERENCE

- a. A Post Award conference with the successful offeror may be held. If needed, it will be held within ten (10) calendar days after the date of the contract award, and it will be held at time and place agreed to by the BLM and the contractor in consultation.
- b. A Pre-Work Conference shall be held after the issuance of each Task Order and prior to the start of the trapping activities.. Time and location shall be determined by the BLM/COR/PI.

#### H.7 INDEMNIFICATION

- a. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Government, its agents, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including but not limited to, attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from the performance of the work, provided that any such liability, claim, damage, loss or expense is (1) attributable to bodily or personal injury, sickness, disease, or death (including that sustained by the Contractor's or subcontractor's employees), or to injury to or destruction of tangible property (other than the work itself) including the loss of use therefrom; and (2) caused in whole or in part by any act or omission of the Contractor, any subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone from whose acts any of them may be liable, regardless of whether or not it is caused in part by any negligent act or omissions, whether active or passive, by a party indemnified hereunder. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge or otherwise reduce any other right or obligation or indemnity that would otherwise exist.
- b. The obligation of the Contractor under this indemnification clause shall not apply to liability for damages arising from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the Government.

#### H.8 PUBLICITY

- a. The contractor agrees that there shall be no release of any information to the news media regarding the trapping or transportation activities being conducted under this contract.
- b. All information will be released to the news media by BLM/Fforest Service.

#### H.9 AUTHORITY (APR 1998)

Notwithstanding any of the other provisions of this contract, the Contracting Officer shall be the only individual authorized to:

- a. issue task orders
- b. accept nonconforming work,
- c. waive any requirement of this contract, or
- d. modify any term or condition of this contract.

#### H.10 GOVERNMENT FURNISHED PROPERTY AND DATA

The Government is not obligated to furnish any real or personal property or data under this contract, unless specified otherwise in this contract, and the Contractor is not authorized to acquire any real or personal property or data at the Government's expense under this contract unless specifically stated otherwise in this contract.

#### H.11 KEY PERSONNEL

- a. The contractor shall assign to this contract the following key personnel: TBD
- To Be Determined during Negotiations (Individual names shall be included in the resultant contract as an attachment to Section J. Revisions in accordance with the provisions of this clause will be made by superseding letters to be included in Section J)
- The contractor will provide a list of the key personnel that will be working each gather operation during the prework conference. All personnel shall be from the key personnel list unless substitutes are required (see (d) below)
- d. During the first year of performance, the Contractor shall make no substitutions of key personnel unless the substitution is necessitated by illness, death, termination of employment, or otherwise approved by the CO. The contractor shall notify the contracting Officer within 15 calendar days after the occurrence of any of these events and provide information required by paragraph (c) below. After the initial year, the contractor shall submit the information required by paragraph (c) to the Contracting Officer at least 15 calendar days prior to making any permanent substitution. All changes in personnel will require a resume with address, phone number, references and their availability to work during the gather season and their role in the organization.
- e. The contractor shall provide an explanation of the circumstances necessitating the proposed substitution, complete resumes (phone numbers, address, references and availability to work during the trapping season) for the proposed substitutes, and any additional information requested by the Contracting Officer. Proposed substitutions should have comparable qualifications to those of the persons being replaced. The Contracting Officer will notify the contractor within 15 calendar days after receipt of all required information of the decision on substitutions. The key listing of personnel shall be modified by superseding letters as an attachment to Section J as stated in (a) above.

#### H.12 CONFIDENTIALITY OF INFORMATION

- a. To the extent that the work under this contract requires that the Contractor be given access to confidential or proprietary business, technical, or financial information belonging to the Government or other companies, the Contractor shall after receipt thereof, treat such information as confidential and agrees not to appropriate such information to its own use or to disclose such information to third parties unless specifically authorized by the Contracting Officer in writing. The foregoing obligations, however, shall not apply to:
  - 1. Information which, at the time of receipt by the Contractor, is in public domain;
  - 2. Information which is published after receipt thereof by the Contractor or otherwise becomes part of the public domain through no fault of the Contractor;
  - Information which the Contractor can demonstrate was in his possession at the time of receipt thereof and was not acquired directly or indirectly from the Government or other companies;
  - 4. Information which the Contractor can demonstrate was received by it from a third party who did not require the Contractor to hold it in confidence.
- b. The Contractor shall obtain the written agreement, in a form satisfactory to the Contracting Officer, of each employee permitted access, whereby the employee agrees that he shall not discuss, divulge or disclose any such information or data to any person or entity except those persons within the Contractor's organization directly concerned with the performance of the contract.

- c. The Contractor agrees, if requested by the Government, to sign an agreement identical, in all material respects, to the provisions of this clause, with each company supplying information to the Contractor under this contract, and to supply a copy of such agreement to the Contracting Officer. From time to time upon request of the Contracting Officer, the Contractor shall supply the Government with reports itemizing information received as confidential or proprietary and setting forth the company or companies from which the Contractor received such information.
- d. The Contractor agrees that, upon request by the Contracting Officer, it shall execute a DOI-approved agreement with any party whose facilities or proprietary data it is given access to or is furnished, which restricts use and disclosure of the data or the information obtained from the facilities. Upon request by the Contracting Officer, such an agreement shall also be signed by Contractor personnel.
- e. This clause shall flow down to all subcontracts.

#### **H.13 TECHNICAL DIRECTION**

- a. Technical direction must be within the scope of work stated in the contract. The COR does not have the authority to, and may not, issue any technical direction which:
  - 1. Constitutes an assignment of additional work outside the Statement of Work;
  - 2. Constitutes a change as defined in the contract clause entitled "Changes", located in Section I;
  - 3. Causes an increase or decrease in the total price or the time required for contract performance;
  - 4. Changes any of the expressed terms, conditions or specifications of the contract; or
  - 5. Interferes with the Contractor's right to perform the terms and conditions of the contract.
- b. The term "technical direction" is defined to include:
  - Directions to the Contractor which redirect the contract effort, shifts work emphasis between work areas or tasks, requires pursuit of certain lines of inquiry, fills in details or otherwise serves to accomplish the contractual Statement of Work.
  - 2. Providing written information to the Contractor which assists in the interpretation of drawings, specifications or technical portions of the work description.
  - 3. Review, and where required by the contract, approval of technical reports, drawings, specifications and technical information to be delivered by the Contractor to the Government under the contract.
- Technical directions can be issued in writing or verbally by the COR.
- d. The Contractor shall proceed promptly with the performance of technical directions duly issued by the COR in the manner prescribed by this article and within his authority under the provisions of this clause. If, in the opinion of the Contractor, any instruction or direction by the COR falls within one of the categories defined in (a)(1) through (5) of this clause, the Contractor shall not proceed but shall notify the Contracting Officer in writing within five (5) working days after receipt of any such instruction or direction and shall request the Contracting Officer to modify the contract accordingly. Upon receiving the notification from the Contractor, the Contracting Officer shall:

#### H.15 OTHER CONTRACTS

The Contractor shall not commit or permit any act which shall interfere with the performance of work by any other Contractor or by Government employees.

#### H.16 HEALTH AND SAFETY

#### H.17 STATE AND LOCAL TAXES

The Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) will be the sponsoring official, and will make the arrangements for personal identity verification and card issuance and the following shall be applicable.

- a. At least two weeks before start of contract performance, the Contractor will identify all contractor and subcontractor personnel who will require [physical and/or logical] access for performance of work under this contract. The Contractor must make their personnel available at the place and time specified by the COR in order to initiate screening and background investigations. Government personnel may contact the contractor personnel being screened or investigated in person, by telephone or in writing, and the Contractor agrees to make them available for such contact.

- c. Alternatively, if an individual has already been credentialed by another agency through OPM, and that credential has not yet expired, further investigation may not be necessary. Provide the COR with documentation that supports the individual's status.
- d. During performance of the contract, the Contractor will keep the COR apprised of changes in personnel to ensure that performance is not delayed by compliance with credentialing processes. Upon successful completion of the NAC process, an identification card will be issued and access granted.
- f. Simultaneously, a NAC with Inquiries (NACI) will be initiated to determine the individual's suitability for the position. If the NACI adjudication is favorable, nothing more needs to be done. If the adjudication is unfavorable, the credentials will be revoked. In the event of a disagreement between the Contractor and the Government concerning the suitability of an individual to perform work under this contract, DOI shall have the right of final determination.
- g. This requirement must be incorporated into any subcontracts that require subcontractor personnel to have routine and regular unsupervised access to a Federally controlled facility for more than 180 calendar days or unsupervised access to a Federally controlled Level 3 or 4 information system.

#### 1. TYPE OF INSURANCE

Employer's liability coverage of at least \$100,000. is required except in States with exclusive or monopolistic funds that do not permit workers' compensation to be written by private carriers.

  - i. THIS MANDATORY INSURANCE PROVISION SHALL FLOW DOWN TO ALL SUBCONTRACTORS
- b. Each policy shall have a certificate evidencing the insurance coverage. ### STATEMENT OF WORK

### Murderers Creek Territory Bait Trap-Oregon

### 1. HMA/TERRITORY NAME:

Murderers Creek

### 2. Capture Method:

Bait trapping.

### 3. TIME-FRAME:

September 15, 2012 - April 31, 2013

### 4. DESCCRIPTION OF THE WORK AREA:

Murderers Creek Wild Horse Territory is located in Bait Trap Zone 1, cooperatively managed by the Prineville District BLM and the Malheur National Forest, 25 to 40 miles southwest of John Day, OR. The Territory encompasses approximately 143,000 acres of Forest Service, BLM, Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) and private lands. (See Vicinity and Project Maps-Attached) The project area may be reached from John Day, Oregon by way of US 395 and County Road 63.

Vegetation in the area consists of a mix of thick timber and shrubland/grassland plant communities. Topography is mountainous terrain with moderately steep to very steep ridges with heavily timbered drainages with the elevation ranging from 4,500 feet to 6,500 feet. Climate is represented by hot dry summers and cold winters with temperatures ranging from below zero in the winter to 90 degrees Fahrenheit or above in the summer. Annual average precipitation ranges from 11 inches in the lower elevation to 30 inches in the higher elevations. Most precipitation occurs as snowfall between November and April. Generally, water is easily accessible throughout the Murderers Creek HMA all year long.

### 5. CAPTURE/REMOVAL NUMBERS:

Capture and remove up to 200 wild horses from the within and immediately outside the territory boundary from as soon as notice to proceed is issued through April 31, 2013. Because the gather period extends over two fiscal years, gather numbers will include trapping and removal of up to 95 horses from the time the notice to proceed is issued through September 30, 2012. The remaining 105 horses shall be captured and removed from October 1, 2012 through April 31, 2013.

### 6. Removal Priority:

Trapping operations would begin at higher elevation portions of the HMA located on USFS land through late summer and into the fall. Trapping would move to lower elevations on BLM and private lands when weather conditions prohibit access to USFS land. Horses ranging in riparian areas and on private lands would receive priority for removal as directed by the COR.

No trapping would occur on BLM-managed lands until all National Environmental Policy Act requirements and resource clearances have been completed, AND until authorized by the gather COR. This is anticipated to occur around November 1, 2012.

### 7. POPULATION SUPPRESSION TREATMENT TO BE USED:

This is a capture and removal gather only with no release horses.

### 8. UNUSUAL/ADDITIONAL NEEDS FOR THE GATHER:

There are no anticipated special needs for horses captured during the gather. All gather proposals should address personnel experience in conducting bait trap gathers in mountainous terrain and the availability of the contractor to perform gather operations for an extended period of time. Proposals shall also address the ability and equipment necessary to perform bait trap gathers in inclement weather and snow cover. Because gather operations could occur during the spring foaling season, proposals should also address contractor experience with handling and care of young foals.

# <u>Failure to address these criteria may result in your proposal being removed from consideration</u>

This job requires use of certified noxious weed free hay and/or other weed free processed feeds and supplements. Salt-only blocks shall be used when forage type attractants are not effective as bait. Other types of forage/supplement attractants shall be approved by the COR prior to use.

### 9. ADDITIONAL HOLDING TIME NEEDED:

Additional holding time is not anticipated for any captured horses.

### 10. WILDERNESS AREAS SPECIAL ACCESS NEEDS:

There is no designated Wilderness in the immediate area. The Aldrich Wilderness Study Area is located in the extreme northwest corner of the Territory on BLM Lands. The Dry

Cabin and Shaketable Roadless areas are located on the northern and northwestern portion of Forest Service lands within the Territory. Trapping will not occur in these areas. The Murderers Creek/Flagtail Cooperative Travel Management Area (CTMA) includes roads within the Murderers Creek Wild Horse Territory. Road closures within the CTMA occur from August 22 – October 10 and October 21 – November 11. Trapping may be allowed on roads within the CTMA with written approval from the Malheur National Forest.

Trap locations may be located on privately owned lands within the HMA. The contractor will be responsible for obtaining written permission from the landowner when accessing private lands.

### 11. CENSUS INFORMATION AND MAPS:

Copies of maps, census information, and other pertinent information will be provided to the contractor at the pre-work conference. A copy of the 2012 census map is also attached.

### 12. DESTINATION OF TRANSPORTED HORSES:

All captured horses will be transported to the Burns Wild Horse Corrals. Travel distance from the territory to the Burns Corrals is approximately 85-100 loaded miles. No horses will be released back to the range.




